

About us....

The Town of Lee Ambulance Service is a municipal entity of the Town of Lee, MA which was formed in 1968.

There are currently 30 members on our roster. The service is licensed at the Advanced Life Support-Intermediate level. Of the 30 members today, 10 are EMT-Intermediate's and 1 EMT-Paramedic.

Becoming an EMT today means a serious commitment by each member. An EMT-Basic class requires a minimum of 110 hours of training, an additional 200+ hours of training for EMT-Intermediate, and 1200+ for an EMT-Paramedic. Each EMT must attain a minimum of 48 hours of continuing education and attend a refresher course every 2 years to maintain their certification. Not only is this a significant commitment by each member, but also by their families.

Currently Lee Ambulance responds to more than 900 emergency calls per year and serves the towns of Lee, Stockbridge, and Tyringham, and a 20 mile section of the Mass Turnpike.

Lee Ambulance currently has members on our roster from a number of Berkshire towns including Lenox, Stockbridge, Pittsfield and Dalton.

While we are primarily a volunteer service, we do have two full time employees covering our daytime hours while most of our volunteers are at work.

Day to day operations, training, equipment, vehicles, and building expenses are paid for through revenue generated and not taxation. This and the time generously donated by our volunteers has allowed us to offer exceptional patient care and service to the communities we serve.

The Ambulance Service also provides public safety and educational services to the community through public first-aid and CPR classes. We also provide first-aid coverage at special events and sport activities.
