### **Holiday Trees/Greens**

- If you buy a live tree, ask your local nursery how to plant it.
- Make your own tree or decorate one outside.

If you use holiday greens (not artificial), you can take them to the Monte Vista Farm (190 East Street) for the goats (NO TINSEL, WIRE, OR SPRAYED ITEMS). Or contact the Lions Club (413-281-9495); leelions1965@gmail.com), which will pick up your greens (again, no tinsel, etc.) on January 6th from 9 am to noon and take them to the farm. The suggested donation is \$5 (payable to the Lee Lions Club). Donations can be mailed to Lee Lions PO Box 19, Lee, MA 01238, if you can't leave yours with the greens.

## Holiday Cards Can Be Made From:

- · Used cards and postcards
- Calendar pictures
- Decorated scrap cardboard
- Homemade recycled paper



### **Alternative Gift Ideas:**

- Make a charitable contribution in the name of family members or friends.
- Give something of your own that you no longer need or want or regift.
- Check out thrift stores, used book stores, and used music stores.
- Give tickets to a movie, theater, concert, museum, or other experience.

- Give someone a membership to a philanthropic, environmental, or relief organization.
- Offer to do someone's household chores, babysit, or run errands.
- Create a scrapbook.
- Bake cookies or other special treats.



## What's Recyclable?

- Paper shopping bags rope and plastic handles are acceptable
- **Gift tissue paper** no metallics or glitter
- Gift wrap/gift bags no glitter or metallics
- **Greeting cards** no metallic inks, foil, wire, batteries or glitter
- Paperboard and corrugated cardboard boxes
- Catalogs

### What Isn't?

- Ribbons, bows, tinsel
- Packing peanuts
- Styrofoam blocks
- Plastic blister packaging from toys or electronics
- Non-recyclable wrapping paper
   (Simply put, if you're able to scrunch up a piece of wrapping paper—that stays scrunched up—it's likely safe to recycle.
