Goodwill will not take these

- Auto waste-antifreeze, used parts
- Paint, paint thinner
- Pesticides
- Mirrors without frames
- Sleeping bags-homeless shelters and pet shelters
- Toys-if they have little pieces like Legos
- All cleaning supplies
- Skis, ski poles, ski boots-tag sales or Freecycle
- Exercise equipment- tag sales or Freecycle

Recycle

- **Goodwill** can take computers, computer monitors, TVs, laptops, e-readers, Portable DVD players and stereos. Bean bag chairs (bean bag filling, expanded polystyrene (EPS) can actually be recycled by separately containing the small beans in a clear plastic bag for your recycling bin).
- **Staples** cell phones, computers, computer monitors, printers, toners, tablets, scanners, and rechargeable batteries, soda stream cylinders, paper shredders
- Lee Post Office and Lee Library (on the shelving along the children's section) Eyeglasses

Reuse

- Scrap paper for notes
- Plastic bags-rinse them and reuse or line your garbage pails
- Linen, towels-rags, handkerchief, napkin
- Glass jars and plastic containers to store beans and other items
- Reusable water bottle and bags
- Egg cartons-plant seeds
- Print on other side of paper
- Use your bread bags or other items that come in bags
- Make your own wrapping paper by using leftover newspapers or scrap material

Refuse

- Make salad dressing, yogurt, granola, and hummus
- Plastic bags bring your own reusable bag, or buy in bulk and produce without bags. Make or buy cotton mesh bags
- Seltzer Bottles buy a soda stream
- Paper tissue products make your own handkerchiefs
- No junk mail or unwanted magazines:
 - 1. <u>DirectMail.com</u> provides a free service to remove your name from commercial mailing lists
 - 2. Catalog Choice is a free service to stop delivery of unwanted catalogs
 - 3. OptOutPrescreen.com offers a free service to end pre-approved credit card and insurance offers
- Buy bulk
- Coffee paper filters use a metal coffee filter
- Buy individual produce or fruit rather than packaged produce
- Use electric shavers instead of buying disposable ones.
- Brew with loose leaf tea instead of tea bags
- Purchase a reusable garment bag and ask your dry cleaner to use that instead of plastic clothing covers
