
October 1, 2020 Annual Town Meeting Warrant

COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS BERKSHIRE, SS.

To any of the Constables of the Town of Lee, Greetings:



In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby directed to notify all of the inhabitants of the Town of Lee, qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the Lee Middle/High School Auditorium on Thursday, October 1, 2020 at the hour of 7:00 p.m. in the evening, for the purposes then and there, to take action upon the following Articles, namely:

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT ARTICLES

Article 1. Town Reports

To receive the reports of the Selectmen, Town Accountant and the other officers, boards, commissions and committees of the Town.

Article 2. Salary of Elected Officials

To see if the Town will vote to fix the salaries of all elected officials as required by law for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 3. Transfer of Proceeds from the Sale of Cemetery Lots to Perpetual Care Account To see if the Town will vote to authorize the transfer of the sum of \$600, or any other amount, from the Sale of Cemetery Lots receipts to the Fairmont Perpetual Care Trust Account, or to take other action relative thereto.

Finance Committee recommends approval.

Article 4. Omnibus Fiscal Year 2021 General Fund Operating Budgets

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds any sum or sums of money for the maintenance of the several departments of the Town and for any other necessary changes, or pass any vote or votes relative thereto.

Article 8. Blanket Grant Application Authorization

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen, or other Town Departments with the knowledge of the Board of Selectmen, to apply for and accept grants from the Federal Government, Commonwealth of Massachusetts or any other source, to execute any documents in connection with said applications and to expend grant funds for purposes received without further appropriation, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Finance Committee recommends approval.

Article 9. Road Repair and Paving (Chapter 90)

To see if the Town will vote to expend those sums from fiscal year 2020 "Chapter 90" funds as provided by the Commonwealth; or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 10. Omnibus Fiscal Year 2021 General Fund Operating Budgets

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds any sum or sums of money for the following purposes:

Article 11. Shared Chief Administrative Officer with the Town of Lenox

To see if the Town will vote to endorse the Board of Selectmen entering into a new Intermunicipal Agreement with the Town of Lenox to share the services of a "Chief Administrative Officer" who will serve as the Town Administrator in the Town of Lee and Town Manager in the Town of Lenox, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 12. Board of Public Works - Members Serving as Elected Officials

To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to petition the General Court to revoke so much of Chapter 438 of the Acts of 1970 that prohibits elected officers in the Town of Lee from serving on the Board of Public Works, and specifically, removing the words "or any holder of an elected office in the Town of Lee" from said Act, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 13. Ratify Amendment to Berkshire Sterile TIF Agreement

To see if the Town will vote to affirm the amendment to the Tax Increment Financing agreement between the Town of Lee and Berkshire Sterile Manufacturing, said agreement being the same as that currently on file in the Town Clerk's office, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 14. Disposition of Real Property – Valley Street – Patriot Armored Systems, LLC. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the care, custody and control of a parcel of land, for Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and no Cents (\$5,500.00), being a certain property, located on Valley Street, being Assessor's Map 2, Parcel 4C, said parcel containing 0.1 acre, from any board or commission having care and custody of said parcel, to the Board of Selectmen for general municipal purposes and for the purpose of conveyance, and further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen to convey said parcel pursuant to G.L. c. 30B, section 16, on such terms and conditions, and for such consideration, as the Board of Selectmen deems appropriate, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 15. Repeal Infrastructure Surcharge

To see if the Town will vote to amend or revoke its acceptance of Massachusetts General Law Chapter 40, Section 39M under Article 35 of the Warrant for the 2016 Annual Town Meeting, said acceptance being the creation of a water infrastructure surcharge on real property for maintenance, improvements and investments to the municipal drinking, wastewater and storm water assets, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 16. CITIZEN PETITION – Withdraw Support for Rest of River Settlement
To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Clerk and/or Town Counsel to place a
question on the May 2020 Town Meeting Warrant that would enable Lee Town Representatives
to vote on the approval of the Rest of the River Settlement agreement.
This warrant article vote shall represent the will and voice of the residents of the Town of Lee in
regards to the Rest of the River Settlement agreement. This warrant article vote shall record the
rejection of the agreement and request the Selectmen rescind their support the Rest of the River
Settlement agreement.

Motion to instruct the Board of Selectmen to rescind their support of the Rest of the River Settlement agreement and renegotiate terms that shall not include a dump site in the Town of Lee.

Article 17. CITIZEN PETITION – Expand Board of Selectmen from 3 to 5 Members
To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to petition the Legislature to
amend Section 2 of Chapter 471 of the Acts and Resolves Massachusetts, namely, the special act
entitled "AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SELECTMEN-ADMINISTRATOR FORM OF
GOVERNMENT IN THE TOWN OF LEE" to replace Section 2, which provides for three select
board members, with the following new section: "Section 2. The board of selectmen shall
consist of five members elected by the voters of the town. Selectmen in office at the time of

approval of this act shall serve until the term which they were elected shall have expired, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 18. CITIZEN PETITION - Technical Information Center - PCBs

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or to transfer from available funds the sum of \$25,000, or any other amount, to create a Technical Information Center accessible to all. The content of said Center to be relevant documents, videos, and materials in any other media relating to all aspects of PCBs, including health effects, environmental persistence, transportation, removal, and remediation. The purpose of this library is to promote an "Informed Citizenry" that can competently advise the town on the management of PCBs removed from the Housatonic River and environs as part of the GE/EPA "Rest of River Settlement Agreement".

Article 19. CITIZEN PETITION - "Citizen Scientists"/Monitoring PCBs

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or to transfer from available funds the sum of \$50,000, or any other amount, to train "Citizen Scientists" in best practices for independently measuring, monitoring, and reporting levels of PCBs in the Town of Lee as a baseline before removal from the Housatonic River and environs as part of the GE/EPA "Rest of River Settlement Agreement", and to commit the Town to supporting the continuance of such a training program and the associated costs of monitoring kits as long as there are significant quantities of PCBs present anywhere in Town.

Article 20. CITIZEN PETITION - Community Preservation Act

To see if the Town will vote in response to the following request submitted to, and certified by, the Town Clerk as a Citizen Petition:

"...that the question of adopting sections 3 to 7 of Chapter 44B of the General Laws of Massachusetts also known as the Community Preservation Act, which establishes a dedicated funding source to enable cities and towns to (1) acquire open space, which includes land for park and recreational uses and the protection of public drinking water well fields, aquifers and recharge areas, wetlands, farm land, forests, marches, beaches, scenic areas, wildlife preserves and other conservation areas, (2) acquire and restore historic buildings and sites, and (3) create affordable housing, be placed on the ballot for the next municipal election.

In Lee Massachusetts, the funding source for these community preservation purposes will be a surcharge of 1-3% (to be decided at the town meeting) on the annual property tax assessed on real property and annual distributions made by the state from a trust fund created by the Act. If approved, the following will be exempt from the surcharge: (1) property owned and occupied as a domicile by any person who qualifies for low income housing or low or moderate income senior housing in Lee, as defined in Section 2 of said Act; (2) class three, commercial and class four, industrial properties as defined in G.L. c.59.&2A; (3) \$100,000 of the value of each taxable

parcel of residential real property; (4) for 100,000 of the value of each taxable parcel of class three, commercial property and class four industrial property as defined in section 2A of said chapter 59. A taxpayer receiving a regular property tax abatement of exemption will also receive a pro rata reduction in surcharge.

A Community Preservation Committee will be established by by-law to study preservation resources, possibilities and needs and to make annual recommendations to town council/town meeting on spending the funds. At least 10% of the funds for each fiscal year will be spent or reserved for later spending on each of the Act's three community preservation purposes: (1) open space, (2) historic resources and (3) affordable housing."

You Are hereby directed to serve this Warrant by posting true and attested copies thereof, in five public places within the Town of Lee, seven (7) days at least, before the day and hour of holding said meeting.

Therefore, Fail Not and make due return of said Warrant with your doing thereon to the Town Clerk of the Town of Lee, at or before the day and hour of holding said meeting.
