DISEASE INJURY/ PREVENTION PROJECTS

VACCINE PROGRAM: The SBPHC had a successful first flu clinic season offering 29 clinics throughout the region. We offered regular dose flu vaccine (ages 6 months +), high-dose flu (age 65 years+), Pfizer Bivalent Booster for ages 5-11 years old and 12+ years old. State supplied flu vaccine was provided for children 18 years of age & under and for those that are uninsured. Flu vaccines were supplied in pre-filled syringes and COVID vaccine was drawn up from multidose vials. Ongoing appointments are available at Tri-Town for anyone still needing a flu vaccine or a Pfizer Booster dose.

There were 26 high-dose flu, 3 regular dose flu and 30 Pfizer Bivalent Boosters provided.

SBPHC facilitates the SCOWG, which is a group comprised of a wide variety of organizations working a variety of goals around substance use disorder (SUD) in Southern Berkshire County. This group continues to work on establishing and promoting a sharps collection program in South County, identifying locations and a system for Naloxone rescue kits and assisting police departments to find a new process to get rid of their prescription drugs now that Community Eco Power is no longer open as an incineration site.
